BIOL 2301/2311 Anatomy & Physiology I (4hrs) BIOL 2302/2312 Anatomy & Physiology II (4hrs) BIOL 2041/2042 Microbiology (4hrs) MATH 1680 Elementary Statistics (3hrs) CHEM 1410/1430 General Chemistry I (4hrs) CHEM 1420/1440 General Chemistry II (4hrs) CHEM 2370/3210 Organic Chemistry I (4hrs) PSYC 1630 General Psychology I (3hrs)

Additional Requirements by School

Baylor University

BIOL 3451 Genetics (3hrs) Additional Psychology Elective (3hrs) ENGL 1310 College Writing (3hrs) Requires BLS (Basic Life Support) Certification BIOL 3500 Medical Terminology Recommended

Hardin-Simmons

Biology Coursework (8hrs) Recommended: BIOL 1710/1720/1760 ENGL 1310 College Writing (3hrs) SOCI 1510 Intro to Sociology Only requires 4hrs of Chemistry

Interservice U.S. Army

English Writing/Composition (6hrs)

Humanities (6hrs)—Options: Government, History, Foreign Language, Art, Social Science, and Religion

- MATH 1100 or higher (3hrs)
- Does not require Statistics and will not satisfy the College Algebra or higher requirement
- Only requires 6 hours of Chemistry
- BIOL 3500 Medical Terminology (2hrs)

Does not require Microbiology or Organic Chemistry

Bachelor's degree is not required—60 hours minimum

Texas Tech University

BIOL 3451 Genetics (3hrs)

- BIOC 3621 Elementary Biochemistry (3hrs) or BIOC 4540 Biochemistry I (3hrs) will be accepted in place of Organic Chemistry
- Does not require General Chemistry

Recommended: HDFS 1013, BIOL 3510, BIOL 4201, and BIOL 3500

UNT Health Sciences Center

Additional Social Science Elective from one of the following areas: ANTH, PSYC, or SOCI (3hrs)

MATH 1100 College Algebra (3hrs) or higher

- Does not require General Chemistry*
- Requires two advanced courses (6hrs) from the following: BIOL 3451, BIOL 4201, BIOL 3510, BIOL 4751, BIOL 4250, BIOL 4300, BIOL 3621 or 4540

UT San Antonio

BIOL 1710/1720/1760 Biology I & II with Iab (8hrs) CHEM 2380/3220 Organic Chemistry II (4hrs) BIOC 3621 Elementary Biochemistry (3hrs) or BIOC 4540 Biochemistry I (3hrs)

BIOL 3451 Genetics (3hrs)

Will accept PSYC 3620 (Developmental Psychology) or PSYC 4610 (Abnormal Psychology) in place of PSYC 1630 General Psychology

Does not require General Chemistry

UT Medical Branch

BIOL 1710/1720/1760 Biology I & II with lab (8hrs)

BIOL 4201 Immunology (3hrs) Subs are available for this prereq. See website.

BIOL 3451 Genetics (3hrs)

Requires two courses (6hrs) from the following: Psychology and Sociology. PSYC 1630 General Psychology will count towards this requirement.

BIOL 3500 Medical Terminology (2hrs)

Will accept Biochemistry in place of Organic Chemistry

***If received CLEP or AP credit for BIOL 1710/1720/1760, you must receive 8 hours of

additional Biology coursework with a letter grade

UT Southwestern

BIOL 3451 Genetics (3hrs)

Does not require Statistics, but recommended and can replace MATH 1100 College Algebra

Recommended Courses: BIOC 3621 or 4540, BIOL 3510, HLTH 2200, BIOL 4201, BIOL 3500, BIOL 4250, Spanish, MATH 1680

UT Rio Grande Valley

BIOL 1710 General Biology I (3hrs)

BIOL 1720 General Biology II (3hrs)

BIOL 3451 Genetics (3hrs)

Does not require labs for all science courses, though some labs are required to enroll in other prerequisite coursework. It would also be beneficial to take the labs to be competitive for other PA schools.

Biochemistry can replace Organic Chemistry

Note: Though some PA programs do not require Biology I & II, these courses are prerequisites for Microbiology and upper-level Biology courses at UNT. Likewise, General Chemistry I & II are prerequisites for enrollment in Organic Chemistry.

Program requirements may change without notice and vary with each school; you are still responsible for checking schools' websites for admissions information. Please see your academic advisor to further explore the requirements of the school in which you are interested.
